## ABSTRACT

Prior to COVID-19, this global market, valued at 639 billion USD, experienced significant growth, particularly in Asia-Pacific and Europe, facilitating cross-border access to diverse healthcare options. The pandemic, however, drastically impacted global tourism, resulting in a 74% reduction in international arrivals and substantial revenue losses in 2020, thereby significantly accelerating innovation and adaptation within the health tourism industry.
